DSL Okay, let's start by just getting comfortable. Let's start by asking, tell me about what happened that night that you got involved in events connected with the autopsy of President Kennedy.

Reibe Well, I was on duty at the naval medical schools in Bethesda, Maryland, when President Kennedy was assassinated. And we spent the better part of the day just watching everything on TV, and that night, I was the staff photograph on call, even though I was a student. I got a call from the Washington Post, it was the first time I heard that he was coming to Bethesda. And they wanted some photographs of the autopsy, and I didn't know what they were talking about at the time. So I went up and I talked to the duty officer, and he said that they didn't know anything about President Kennedy. That they didn't know that President Kennedy was coming in at that time of the evening, so I went back down to the photo department and just sat down, I was watching more of the news and all that on
