also you can pick up a few diagrams of <sup>plans</sup> at any filling station and send them along. Dad, these Russians seem interested in learning how to play, as I thought maybe you could help me out and together

will show them a little bit of American sport.

Our deal about the visas is not getting any better, and I think about new years, I'll fly into Moscow, and go to the Embassy about it.

As time goes on, our complaints, and their inactivity, will bring things to a head, and one side or the other will break.

We sent you a can of a kind of Russian candy, called "KHACHIVA"; it's made from grain and sugar. so when you'll open the package you'll know it's candy. I eat alot of it, if you all like it, we'll send some more.

We'll send all this on about Dec. 1 so you should receive it about Christmas (I hope).
