Mr. GEORGE ROBERT PHENIX, 2550 Klondike, advised he is a newsman associated with KRLD-TV for the past six weeks. He advised that on the morning of November 24, 1963, he went to the Dallas police station and was immediately admitted to the basement without identifying himself. He advised no one had questioned him regarding his identity or as to his business there. PHENIX advised he was carrying a 16 milimeter sound camera.

He related that prior to LEE HARVEY OSWALD being brought to the basement floor, he set up his location across the ramp just north of the hallway leading from the elevators. He advised as a wall approached the ramp after entering the garage through the the ideors, he was almost knocked down by someone bursting through the crowd and then he heard a shot. He stated he did not set the person but believes the person who came by him must have been the individual who shot OSWALD.

- PHENIX stated at this time several officers jumped the individual who shot OSWALD and disarmed him.

phenix related that the police immediately blocked off all exits; however, he displayed a badge which reflected that he was with the KENNEDY newsmen and he was immediately allowed to leave the basement. He stated that at no time did he display any identification as to his name or his occupation. He stated, to his knowledge, no other newsmen were asked for their identification.
