In answer to the question raised in your recent letter, you should request Brest as the point of exit on your visa. Although we anticipate that for economy reasons rail travel through Brest to a port of embarkation will be required, it would be a good extra measure of precaution if you could have Moscow airport noted as an alternative exit point. Your wife's visa permits her to exit at any border point.
